Set out on a remarkable journey through Western Canada, where vibrant cities meet unspoiled wilderness. Explore Vancouver and Victoria, including the world-renowned Butchart Gardens, before boarding the iconic Rocky Mountaineer for a spectacular rail journey through mountains, rivers, and canyons. In the Canadian Rockies, experience highlights like Lake Louise and the Athabasca Glacier.

Carefully planned inclusions and a comfortable pace allow time for both guided experiences and independent exploration. It's no surprise this journey remains one of the most sought-after ways to experience Canada's west—a perfect balance of comfort, scenery, and unforgettable moments.



Tuesday, June 8 (Kickback Reception)

This afternoon we will transfer to the **Drury Inn & Suites Nashville Airport**. Tonight, enjoy the hotel's **Kickback Reception** with hot food and cold drinks.

Wednesday, June 9 (Breakfast, Dinner)

Today we are bound for **Vancouver, British Columbia**. Upon arrival, we will take a **sightseeing tour** to discover this delightful city. Take in the scenic beauty of the **North Shore**, see vibrant **Gastown** and North America's second largest **Chinatown**. We'll visit world-famous **Stanley Park** and stop at the **Totem Poles**. Later this afternoon, we'll check into the **Inn at the Quay** for two nights. Meet new friends and enjoy dinner this evening at **The Boathouse**.



Thursday, June 10 (Breakfast)

Our day begins with a morning ferry to **Victoria, British Columbia**. As we travel through the Gulf Islands, keep a watchful eye as the sky and the sea are abundant with wildlife. Upon arrival, we will delight in 55-acres of floral splendor at one of the world's most magnificent gardens, **Butchart Gardens**. After plenty of time to enjoy all of the beauty and get lunch on our own, we depart for **downtown Victoria** to see her famous sites. You'll have time to explore the charming area and do some shopping before we're on our way back to Swartz Bay to catch our return ferry to Vancouver.

Friday, June 11 (Breakfast, Lunch)

This morning we transfer to the Vancouver train station to begin the "**most spectacular train trip in the world**" on board the **Rocky Mountaineer**! Breakfast and lunch will be served on the train. On our **all-daylight rail tour** we will witness dramatic changes in scenery as we journey from **Vancouver** to **Kamloops**. We will travel through the **Pacific Coastal Mountain Range** and then meander along the natural path of the **Thompson River** and alongside impressive **Fraser Canyon**. One of the scenic highlights in the canyon is **Hell's Gate**, where millions of gallons of water per minute rush through the narrowest point of the canyon. Our day concludes as the Rocky Mountaineer travels along the shores of **Kamloops Lake** and into the town of **Kamloops**, the heart of British Columbia's interior. Tonight we will overnight at a Kamloops hotel.

Saturday, June 12 (Breakfast, Lunch)

It's "**all aboard**" this morning at the Kamloops train station for our **second day on the Rocky Mountaineer** as we continue our trek eastward to the mighty **Canadian Rockies** and the province of **Alberta**. Breakfast and lunch are served on board. We'll see a spectacular array of scenery as we travel across ranchlands, along rocky lakeshores, over high mountain passes, and through the remarkable tunnels that form part of the rich rail history of the Canadian Rockies. Today's highlights include **Craigellachie**, where the last spike of the Canadian Pacific Railway was driven, **Castle Mountain**, the climb over **Rogers Pass**, the rugged and scenic **Kicking Horse Canyon**, the **Spiral Tunnels** and, of course, the glaciers and snow-capped peaks of the Canadian Rockies.



Our rail journey ends this evening on arrival in the resort town of **Banff, Alberta**, where we'll check into the **Otter Hotel**, for four nights. The remainder of the evening is free for you to explore this charming town. Passes will be provided for the town shuttle service for the duration of our time here for easy access to many attractions, restaurants, and shopping.

Sunday, June 13 (Breakfast, Dinner)

Today's journey takes us along the magnificent **Icefields Parkway**, considered to be one of the best scenic drives in the world. Our first stop will be the vibrant turquoise-colored **Peyto Lake**, another incredible setting for one of the best photographs in Canada. Visit the **Glacier Discovery Centre**, where we'll have free time to learn about the icefields through their interpretive displays before we board our **Ice Explorer all-terrain vehicles** that will take us to the **Athabasca Glacier**, a 10,000-year-old sheet of ice. We'll be able to walk on, feel, and even drink from the glacier! Afterwards, we head over to the **glass-floored Skywalk** for a jaw-dropping walk at the cliff's edge. We'll enjoy dinner this evening at a popular local restaurant.

Monday, June 14 (Breakfast, Lunch)

We board our motor coach this morning for a fun day of **sightseeing** as we head north through **Banff National Park**. Our first stop is at tranquil **Moraine Lake**, a glacier-fed lake that's surrounded by mountains and waterfalls in the rugged **Valley of the Ten Peaks**. We'll cross the continental divide at **Kicking Horse Pass** as we enter **Yoho National Park**, where we'll view the **Spiral Tunnels**, the **Natural Bridge**, and pristine **Emerald Lake**. Upon arrival in the picturesque town of **Lake Louise**, we'll enjoy lunch at the **Lodge of the Ten Peaks**. Then we'll experience breathtaking views of **Victoria Glacier** as we ride the **Lake Louise Gondola** to the top of the Rockies! We'll have some free time to explore the grounds at one of Canada's most iconic hotels, **Chateau Lake Louise**. Perched on the glistening emerald lake and surrounded by soaring mountain peaks, it makes for one of the most photographed scenes in all of the Canadian Rockies.

Tuesday, June 15 (Breakfast, Dinner)

This morning we depart on a **morning sightseeing tour of Banff National Park**. Highlights will include **Bow Falls**, **Surprise Corner**, the **Hoodoo rock formations**, and **Lake Minnewanka**. After stopping in downtown Banff to drop off those who want to shop, we arrive back at the hotel. The afternoon is free for you to explore Banff independently. You may choose to visit the Banff Museum, shop in the unique stores on Banff Avenue, or relax in the mineral pools at Upper Hot Springs. Dinner will be included at our hotel tonight.

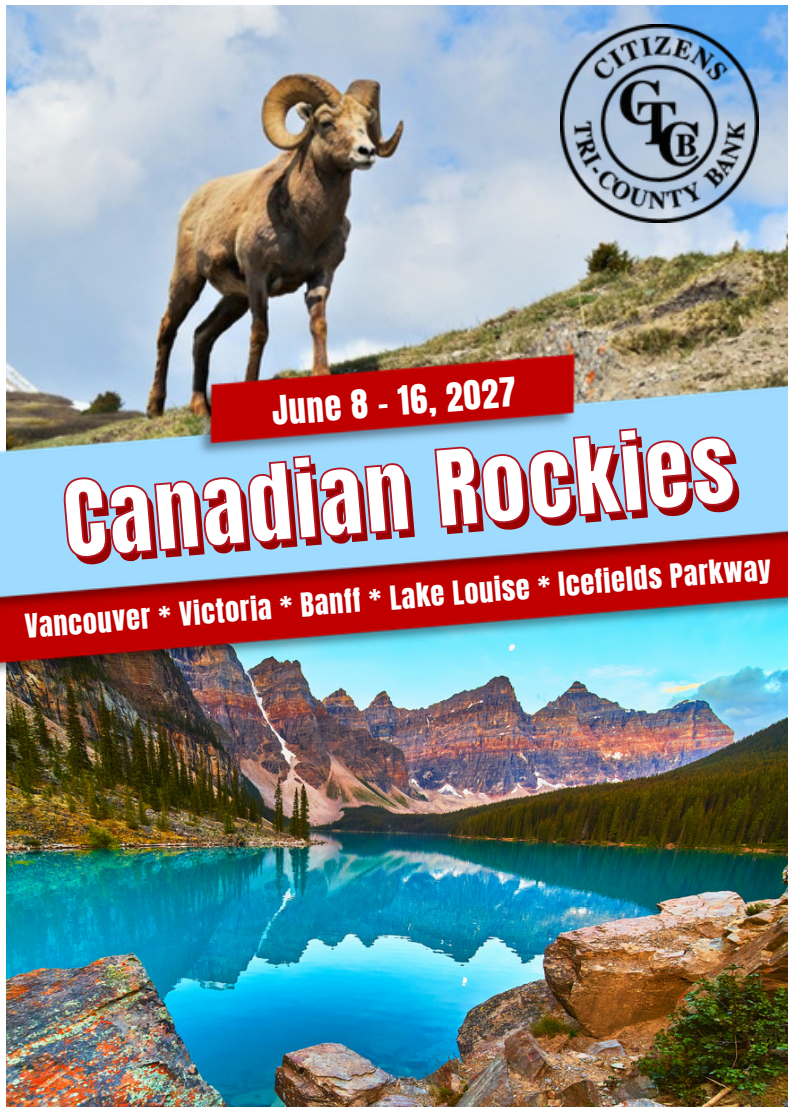
Wednesday, June 16 (Breakfast)
